“ *My Coco was more like a therapy animal to me; as he helped me handle having a chronic illness everyday. He was a great companion, who loved to cuddle, kiss, play and con me and others into more treats just because he's so cute and would run around you until you'd give him something. He was great at almost tripping you because he'd run up to greet you when you walked into the room. And for me, he was the best alarm clock as my face would be licked until I'd pet him and kiss him back. The time would be whatever time he felt like being pet...so the actual time wasn't important here. It was just his need to be loved that was the time. If you look at the video's you'll see he sometimes went to extreme measures to get my attention. Sometimes he'd wake me up for kisses and once I fell asleep without saying goodnight...well he wasn't having any part of that... he jumped on me to wake me up! kind of funny but it didn't work - so later in the night he kissed me instead. He was a gentle soul and one of the best rescued pets I've ever gotten in my life. I'm so glad that I got him. He was a gift from God. All Animals are but some seem to capture more of your heart than others and he captured a lot of my heart.*

It really hurt when I saw something was wrong with him and than we found out he had cancer. Than after doing 9 Radiation treatments and doing plenty of RX's by mouth each day for months and not having the dam thing shrink at all was just frustrating, especially when they thought that the prognoses would be excellent. It wasn't; as it grew, and the pain rx's no longer worked and his breathing got difficult. So I made the hard decision to have someone I trust come to the house to end his life on my bed where he always slept.

It was terrible; as I felt like I betrayed him... but I knew he hated car rides and I told him I'd never put him in a car again. I knew he was struggling and I didn't want him to suffer anymore. So I just held him like we did when we go to sleep each night and he went to sleep forever. I lost my best buddy. But I gave him peace before he was about to start gasping for air and in pain that rx's could not control, so I'm told I did the right thing -- but it just doesn't feel right still.

Cancer sucks in people and in animals. It's not fair.

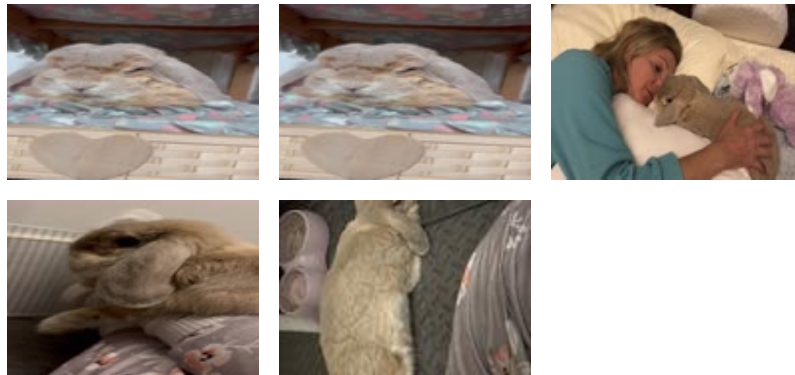
I was able to take my life-less Coco to Pet Rest in Peace the next day and have a lovey service, the lady's that work there are so nice and kind its amazing what a beautiful personal cremation it was and I got his remains back within 90 minutes.
