Kelvin, we hope you’re having a beautiful time in the bardo. We carry you in our hearts and memories.

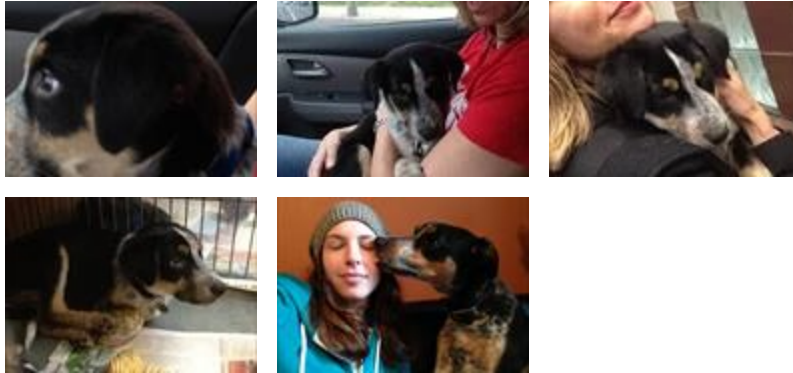
